Community

Golden, Colorado (population 19,400) is the gateway to the Rockies with opportunities to hike, mountain bike, ski and snowboard. Golden lies along Clear Creek at the edge of the foothills of the Front Range of the Rocky Mountains. Golden is home to the Colorado School of Mines, National Renewable Energy Laboratory, National Earthquake Information Center, the American Mountaineering Center, and MillerCoors Brewery. In 2013 the median household income was \$57,226, and the per capita income was \$36,000.

<u>School</u>

Golden High School has a population that is 80% White, 13% Hispanic/Latino, 2% Asian, 2% two or more races, 1% American Indian or Alaska Native, and 1% Black. The percentage of our students on free and reduced lunch is 22%.

Golden High School is the oldest high school in Colorado, established in 1873. We are a public high school, grades 9-12, with a student enrollment of approximately 1250 for the 2015-2016 school year. Golden High School moved into a new, state of the art building in August of 2008. Golden is accredited by the Colorado State Department of Education. We are rated as a Performance School.

Curriculum

The school calendar is based on two 18 week semesters with 6 week Progress Reports. Seven classes per semester is the maximum course load, with most students taking six classes per semester. Golden High School offers a comprehensive curriculum, including college prep classes, engineering, culinary, woodworking, metalworking, and a variety of classes in fine and performance arts.

AP Courses are available in Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Environmental Science, English Language, English Literature, Human Geography, American Government, European History, U.S. History, Psychology, Micro Economics, Studio Art, Music Theory, Statistics, and Calculus AB and BC.

Honors courses are available in English, Geometry, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Choir, and Spanish.

Students may earn transferable college credit by taking College Algebra, Astronomy, and Spanish 4 while attending Golden High School.

Special Programs

GHS offers a unique Senior Seminar program to seniors 2nd semester. Students are selected through a competitive application process to spend the semester in an experiential learning environment.

Each Spring GHS offers juniors the chance to participate in Junior Rafting Trips

GHS is the coordinating school for an annual Summer Field Biology trip to Hawaii

Spanish students have the opportunity to study in Spain each summer at the University of Salamanca.

Grading and Ranking

Weighted grades are given for Advanced Placement, honors, and concurrent enrollment courses.
